The team went on to be undefeated, beating home favourites China in the third game of the tournament. They won the semi-final against the USA to go to the grand-final against Canada. The team scored in the first minutes of the game through Dom De'Toitt and Kellie came on in the last four minutes with some fresh legs to give the team some extra run. The team ended up winning the gold medal comfortably 38-10.

Kellie shared that she was really pleased with her tournament, considering she was still learning the game!
